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The twist in this story: her son dies --- what!

Have you ever felt like God's not keeping His promises? Or that you are not receiving? Or, things just aren't going the way you supposed they would? You are doing everything right, but everything is still going wrong?

This woman felt like her promise had died --- at face value --- her promise was stripped away!

What is her response? Go to God. When we go to God's representatives, in essence, we are going to God!

II Kings 4:22-28 ²² Then she called to her husband, and said, "Please send me one of the young men and one of the donkeys, that I may run to the man of God and come back." ²³ So he said, "Why are you going to him today? It is neither the New Moon nor the Sabbath." And she said, "It is well." ²⁴ Then she saddled a donkey, and said to her servant, "Drive, and go forward; do not slacken the pace for me unless I tell you." ²⁵ And so she departed, and went to the man of God at Mount Carmel. So it was, when the man of God saw her afar off, that he said to his servant Gehazi, "Look, the Shunammite woman! ²⁶ Please run now to meet her, and say to her, 'Is it well with you? Is it well with your husband? Is it well with the child?" And she answered, "It is well." ²⁷ Now when she came to the man of God at the hill, she caught him by the feet, but Gehazi came near to push her away. But the man of God said, "Let her alone; for her soul is in deep distress, and the Lord has hidden it from me, and has not told me." ²⁸ So she said, "Did I ask a son of my lord? Did I not say, 'Do not deceive me'?"

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The Shunammite woman REFUSED to NOT BELIEVE! She BELIEVED. Just as Abraham BELIEVED. Abraham knew if he sacrificed his son, God would resurrect him, because of the PROMISE he received.

Believed --- "Aman" in Hebrew

= Tent Peg = Broken Off =

We need ABSOLUTE FAITH! I am encouraging you to have absolute faith. Resolve to BELIEVE. God can and will keep His PROMISES, even in the extreme.

It is well. The root Hebrew word here is Shalom, meaning PEACE or AT PEACE. Sounds a lot like FAITH-REST!

Sometimes, we just need to get to the feet of Jesus, crying out, "God, I need you to keep your promises! I am hurt, I am sad, I am lonely, I am sick, I am needy, I am broken, I am scared!"

Yet, it is well!

Maybe, you are right there today.

This woman's son died on her lap. What was her response?

Have your dreams, promises, died?

RUSH to Jesus, profess your FAITH, remind Him of His Word and, TRUST.

Can you say, 'IT IS WELL'?
