


HIS BLOOD IS ENOUGH, WILL YOU BELIEVE?

The Torn Veil: Access Granted



Matthew 27:51 says:

“Then, behold, the veil of the temple was torn in two from top to bottom...”

This veil separated humanity from the **Holy of Holies**, the place of God’s presence. Its tearing at Jesus’ death signified that the barrier of sin was removed. But **how** was it removed?

The Blood of Jesus: The Price Paid

Hebrews 10:19–20 makes the connection explicit:

“Therefore, brethren, having boldness to enter the Holiest by the blood of Jesus, by a new and living way which He consecrated for us, through the veil, that is, His flesh...”

The veil wasn’t just fabric—it **symbolized Christ’s body**.

When His flesh was torn on the cross, the temple veil tore too. His **blood** became the means by which we enter God’s presence—not through ritual, but through **relationship**.

Romans 5:6–10: The Heart of the Gospel

This passage explains **why** Jesus’ death matters:

“For when we were still without strength, in due time Christ died for the ungodly... God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us. Much more then, having now been justified by His blood, we shall be saved from wrath through Him. For if when we were enemies we were reconciled to God through the death of His Son, much more, having been reconciled, we shall be saved by His life.” (vv. 6–10)

The Connection:

- **Veil torn** = access to God
- **Blood shed** = justification and peace
- **Romans 5** = the motive: *love*, the method: *sacrifice*, the result: *salvation*

Summary:

The **veil tearing** was the visible sign.
The **blood of Jesus** was the spiritual transaction.
Romans 5:6–10 explains the heart behind it:

God didn't wait for us to be worthy—He tore the veil while we were still broken.

A Call to Salvation

Romans 5:6-10 teaches us that while we were utterly helpless, Christ died for us—while we were still sinners. That His blood justifies us, reconciles us to God, and will save us from God's wrath. Will you believe that?

Before we close, I want to speak to the heart of why we're here. Scripture says:

“The word is near you, in your mouth and in your heart” *if you confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus and believe in your heart that God has raised Him from the dead, you will be saved.* For with the heart one believes unto righteousness, and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation. Romans 10:8-10

And again, we're reminded:

Behold, now is the accepted time; behold, now is the day of salvation.” — 2 Corinthians 6:2

Not tomorrow. Not someday. Today. Right now. If you feel that stirring in your spirit, that pull toward something deeper, don't ignore it. This is your moment.

If you're ready, I invite you to repeat this aloud with me—not as a ritual, but as a

Declaration of Faith:

I believe in my heart that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of the living God.

I believe that He lived, died, paid the price for my sin, and was raised from the dead.
